Utilities and Finance Department Located at 3100 Belmont Blvd.

The City's Utility Billing and Finance Department are now located at the new Municipal Services Facility at 3100 Belmont Blvd (corner of Keene and Belmont).

The utility bill drop box is also located at 3100 Belmont Blvd. The Benton County Elections Department ballot drop box will remain at 3801 W. Van Giesen until the end of August. There is also a ballot drop box located at 3100 Belmont Blvd.

Public Works Projects Update

Brotherhood Transmission Main: The City will be installing a new waterline along SR224/Van Giesen from the post office to Ruppert Road. This work is expected to start the beginning of July. The project will impact traffic through this area from July to October.

Brotherhood Reservoir: A new one million gallon reservoir will be built on the north side of Flat Top to replace the existing smaller reservoir.

Well 11 Wellhouse and Transmission Main: The City will construct the well house for Well 11 and install a water transmission main from Well 11 to Ruppert Road located on the Lewis & Clark Ranch area.

South 38th Avenue/Mt Adams View Reconstruction: The City has partnered with Benton County for the construction of South 38th Avenue and Mt. Adams View Drive connecting South 38th Avenue to Northlake Drive and South 38th Avenue to Bombing Range Road. These new roads will replace existing gravel roads serving both City and County residents.

Bombing Range Road Phase 8: The City will be widening a portion of Bombing Range Road between Silver Lake Court and Arena Road while adding pedestrian and bicycle facilities, storm drainage and illumination. Construction on this project is expected to begin in August.

Collins Road Reconstruction: The City will be widening a portion of Collins Road beginning at the intersection of Collins and Bombing Range Road extending west approximately 1300 LF. Curb and Gutter along with stormwater improvements are planned for this section of roadway. Construction is expected to begin late August.

City Crack Seal and Street Striping Projects: The crack sealing on portions of Keene Road, Paradise Way, Grosscup Road, and Harrington Drive is expected to begin the middle of July while the City wide Striping Project will begin mid to late August.

Recycling Bins Relocation

As part of the South 38th Avenue and Mt. Adams View Drive Roadway Project, the recycling center that is currently located on Mt. Adams View Drive will be consolidated with the recycling center on South 40th Avenue. This will occur during the week of August 13th.

Did You Know...

West Richland Municipal Code 19.04.020 states:

Garage/yard sale signs allowed without permit when all conditions are met:

1. Two movable garage/yard sale signs allowed per sale event;
2. Signs shall not exceed six square feet per sign face or two signs on sticks not exceeding four square feet per sign face;
3. Sale shall not be advertised for a period exceeding three days;
4. Signs may be placed on public street right-of-way or private property with owner's permission;
5. Signs shall not be placed on public utility poles.
