Code Red Emergency Alerts

Emergency Management Agencies of Benton and Franklin Counties use CodeRed, which is a high-speed mass notification system designed to keep you informed in the event of an emergency. This system allows for the delivery of emergency messages to you via phone, landline or mobile device, as well as through text and email.

Generally, non-life threatening alerts will be sent to email only. Alerts that pose a higher threat or cause significant adverse conditions may be sent to email and text message. Emergency alerts that pose a serious or significant risk to life and/or property will be sent to all devices that you have selected.

Yellowstone Trail Community Garden

Would you like to grow your own vegetables in 2022 but lack ground for growing?

The City of West Richland's Community Garden program is accepting applications from interested residents. The Community Garden is located at Yellowstone Trail Park on Austin Drive, near the intersection of Bombing Range Road and Van Giesen Street. The City is partnering with WSU Extension Master Gardeners, who are excited to provide community gardeners with free seeds, expert advice, and mentor assistance throughout the 2022 growing season.

The garden was established through a partnership between volunteers and the City, with assistance from many generous local businesses. The community garden was launched by Mayor Brent Gerry as a community project to enhance the Van Giesen Corridor through beautification, enhancement, volunteerism, and community involvement.

There are 42 raised garden plots available to rent for the 2022 growing season on a first-come, first-serve basis. ADA accessible plots are also available. The City will provide water and garden hoses, but gardeners are responsible for providing all tools.

The fee to reserve a garden plot is \$10 for the 2022 season. Contact the Planning Department at 509-967-5902 for more information.
