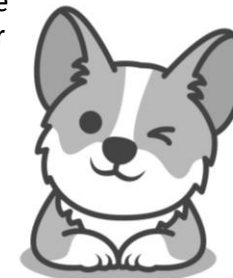

Message from Animal Control

Did you know that a current rabies vaccination for your dog is required per our state law? A rabies vaccination generally comes in two timeframes; the first shot your pet receives, typically given when they are puppies, will last one year. The next shot following that will last three years. A rabies vaccination helps prevent the spread of the rabies virus. Your dog can contract rabies by being injured by an infected animal or possibly even eating an infected animal.

The following is information from Washington State Department of Health: "During the last 25 years, four domestic animals in Washington have been diagnosed with rabies. In 2015, a cat infected with a strain of bat virus was identified in Jefferson County. Previous identifications of animals infected with bat rabies virus include a cat in Walla Walla County in 2002 and a llama in King County in 1994. In 1992, a horse in Benton County died of an unidentified strain of rabies."
