



West Richland City Council Meetings Time Change

The City Council adopted an ordinance changing their regular meeting times from 7:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. beginning May 1st.

Meetings are held on the first and third Tuesday of each month at the new Municipal Services Facility, 3100 Belmont Blvd. Meetings are broadcast live on Charter Cable Channel 191.



Modified Garbage Pickup Routes

Due to continued growth, Ed's Disposal is modifying the current garbage collection routes and associated garbage collection dates for some residential areas in West Richland. Effective Monday, May 21, 2018, the garbage collection date for residents in the Hyde Park residential subdivision will move

from a Monday to a Wednesday collection. Also the garbage collection date for residents south of Morab Street, east of Bombing Range Road and north of Northlake Drive (includes residents on the south side of Northlake Drive), will move from a Friday to a Wednesday collection. Residents will receive an automated phone message about the change on May 11th and will also receive a reminder notice on their garbage cans the week before the change. During the week of May 21st, Hyde Park garbage collection will be on Monday, May 21st and Wednesday, May 23rd, then every Wednesday afterwards.

During the week of May 21st, garbage collection south of Morab Street, east of Bombing Range Road and north of Northlake, will be on Friday, May 18th and Wednesday, May 23rd, then every Wednesday afterwards.

Also, please don't let your dog poo in other people's yards. If it happens before you can stop it, please pick it up.



Did You Know...

West Richland Municipal Code 10.12.045 prohibits non-vehicles from being parked, placed, piled or stored on any city street, sidewalk, alley, or within an improved portion of the public right of way.

Some examples of these would be dumpsters, storage containers, rocks or dirt, basketball hoops, and hockey nets. The ordinance was passed not only because they create traffic hazards for vehicles and pedestrian, but they can also damage roads.

Citizens may apply for a special permit to temporarily allow a "non-vehicle" to be placed, parked, piled or stored on a city street, sidewalk, alley, or in an improved portion of public right of way. The fee for the permit is \$75.00 and may be applied for at the Municipal Services Facility.

Also...

West Richland Municipal Code 8.04.070, "Refuse - Points of collection," states:

The placement of refuse cans shall be on the day designated for collection by the collector and 12 hours immediately before said day of collection and the 12 hours immediately following the day designated for collection. *On all other days the refuse cans shall be removed from the street right-of-way.* The area from which the refuse can is removed shall be maintained free and clear of refuse and garbage.
